Extinction Rebellion welcomes all people, regardless of race, sexual orientation, gender identity, religion, political affiliation, age, ethnicity, economic background, etc. This movement is about all of us! We are you! Anyone who follows our 10 principles and values can take action in the name of Extinction Rebellion.
